The Pastoral Search Committee would like to announce that we have made an offer to a candidate to fill the opening of Pastor at Lewis Creek Baptist Church. We have been searching on behalf of the church since August of 2024. We thank you for all your prayers for the process. Our prayers now should be directed toward the church that we prepare our hearts and minds to receive the Pastor that God has sent to us. Pray also that we have willing hearts and hands to come together to do the work of this church.

The next step in this process is to bring the candidate to the church for a weekend to introduce ourselves and the candidate to each other, hear the candidate preach, then take a congregational vote on the candidate. That weekend will be December 27 & 28, 2025. The 27th will be the meet-and-greet in the morning with church officers. Then, we will gather for lunch so the congregation can meet the candidate. The 28th we will hear the candidate preach at our worship service, then take a vote following the service. More details will be provided later.

We won't be divulging the name of the candidate until the meet-and-greet weekend. If you have any questions, please ask one of the committee members – Myra Crosby, Stewart Douglas, Larry Mohr or Kathy Cord.

plow fields with horses, help my Grandma Braden fire up the big fiery monster of a coal stove in the basement, and travel to a one room school house in Geneva (before being one of Noble's first students) to learn his ABC's.

I'm sure he probably pulled his sister, my Aunt Virginia's braids and teased the girls in school—not too different than my grandson Caleb seems to have an interest in as well. He tells us of a time when he and his sister, Virginia were small. Virginia was having a tea party and when finished she said rather than clean up “let's just kick the table over.” And so that is just what Dad did. On Sunday after lunch, we often use that same line.

But just think of the changes Dad has seen. Milking Betsy with cold hands, putting those newfangled milking machines on a kicking Holstein and if he were milking today perhaps he might even have a computer that monitors how the cow's feeling today. I'm sure he might have picked some corn by hand, then had a two row corn picker that mounted on the tractor and I remember the Gleaner that shelled 4 rows at a time. And today, “farmers?” how big is that combine in your shed?

No one wants to take cash anymore. I tried to pay Dad's Direct TV bill last month. They wouldn't take a check and soon informed me they would not be taking cash in the future. When we were growing up if Dad didn't have the cash, we didn't need whatever we thought we did. Things haven't changed much there. Dad still likes his cash and still doesn't have a credit or debit card.

Remember your first box of crayons, it might have 5 basic colors or ten if you were lucky. My friend just got a new 50 piece box with colors like Mango (I thought that was a tropical fruit and not just sky blue but Cerulean.

So where is this going? Dad grew up in a loving Christian home, attended a one room church where he continued to attend after he was married, and later

moved our family to Lewis Creek. He was and still is soft-hearted for his 3 daughters and 7 granddaughters. He and Mother were married pretty soon after their high school graduation. Their devotion to each other for almost 73 years was a love story out of a storybook, much better than the Young and Restless. When Mom passed, we were not sure he could bear the loss, but here he is still kicking 8 years later (he says not too high). But if you were to ask, he would tell you how much he still misses her terribly. And today he said to me that on this Wednesday September 17th he and Mom would have been married 81 years. Can't remember how many times that Dad was really angry at us girls. (Side note—my two sisters were always perfect angels, so you know who the trouble maker was)... He could give you that “look” which meant straighten up and fly right or else. Dad tries that with Sierra and Caleb but it doesn't seem to have the same effect.

He still lets God help with his decisions — a good man with a great heart and a loving soul. I know I've told you this before. After an exam, his heart doctor told me he had a perfect heart and I replied you are not telling me anything I don't already know. And just this week Dad's eye doctor me that if the dictionary had pictures, George's picture would be next to the to the word “Gentleman”.

He's been living and loving, caring and sharing for 100 years. His dedication to his family and God has been constant. Yours? God hears our voice whenever we cry out to Him. I believe that. However, listening to us and responding immediately are two different things. God's timetable is not always ours, but our eternal God is never late.

When I was eighteen years old, I clearly experienced a call of God to ministry. It didn't come audibly, but what I would describe as a divine impression on my heart. This led me to prepare for ministry at a Christian college and seminary, and I was always engaged in the ministry, starting as an associate pastor in Chicago at age 25, then as pastor of my own church in rural Ohio at age 27. Thirty-six years later, I retired from a large Church in Cleveland, Ohio, and immediately relocated to be near my family in Greenwood, Indiana.

Having served ten years in Indiana, I made myself available for interim work back in Indiana. The Lewis Creek Baptist Church soon contacted me about an interim position in the Spring of 2024. I firmly believe that God opened the door for me to come, and both Ann and I have loved Lewis Creek and felt at home with the church. Knowing that the task before the Search Committee is very difficult and that the number of candidates is much lower today than in years gone by, I knew the position could take years to fill. Therefore, I initiated a conversation with the church to set a service window of eighteen months (a year and a half). I spent some time this summer praying about whether to extend my time if a candidate was not selected before the end of my contract.

Shortly after I took the position as Interim Pastor at Lewis Creek, my parents came for a visit to see our new home and to worship at Lewis Creek. We had a wonderful time together. Little did I know this would be the last time that my parents would hear me preach. Just three months later, my father would pass away, and my mother passed away almost exactly a year following my father's death. It was during the week attending my mother's passing under hospice care that I decided to fulfill the obligation to the

church to serve until November 9th, 2025.

While I would love to be there right up to the call of your next pastor, God has placed it on my heart to move on. God is working at Lewis Creek, and this is part of His plan in preparation for your next pastor. The church has contacted Pastor Jeff Statton to pick up where I left off.

Jeff is an experienced Senior Pastor, native Hoosier, and godly Christian man who is willing to come and serve. God will use him, as He has used me, to equip and prepare the church for the next stage of ministry. I called him last week, and he believes that God has directed him to Lewis Creek at a perfectly timed moment. I will let him tell the story.

Although my official role as Interim pastor will cease after November 9th, I would love to remain in touch and available if needed in the future for pulpit supply or a friendly call, as we have made many good friendships while at Lewis Creek.

Keep faithful and trust the Lord, as God is at work. Galatians 6:9 reminds us, *"Let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up."*
